CAMBODIAN ORPHANS APPEAL

Cambodia is a small and extremely poor Asian country that borders Thailand, Laos and Vietnam. Seventy five percent of the nation's fourteen million people are total subsistence farmers and half the population exist below the poverty line.

Thirty years of war, famine and genocide have ravaged this nation and made it to one of the most impoverished countries in the world.

The abundant and wretched children are Cambodia's most vulnerable citizens and now bear the brunt of its dreadful suffering. To witness these homeless and unwanted children eating insects and vermin to sustain themselves is a truly humbling experience. The poverty is compounded because thousands are maimed or killed each year by landmines - the appalling legacy of previous wars. However, In last five years, Cambodia has seen the introduction of democratic government bringing new peace, stability and hope to this shattered region.

SAVE THE CHILDREN CAMBODIA FOR DEVELOPMENT is a Cambodian charity organization set up in 2005 to build and run a new orphanage in the capital city - Pnomh Penh. The founder of the charity is a Cambodian native who was a monk for ten years. Mr Chan Norn left the monastic life several years ago to work with orphans and teach them english. Last year he made contact with J.T. Magen who funded the purchase of one and a half acres of land and the creation of the charity. The attached photographs show the recent start of construction which includes leveling the site, digging a pond and erecting a dining hall. Funds are now required to complete the construction program and run the orphanage which Chan Norn hopes will house and school up to fifty children.
